B. Collaboration with Another Entity

1. The Branch partnered with the Fairmont Area Chamber of Commerce, MN DEED (Department of Employment and

Economic Development), iseek, and local high schools in sponsoring Area Career Exploration (ACE) day for area sophomores. ACE

focused on exposing students to area careers; providing information about corresponding educational requirements; identifying career

clusters based upon students' interests and abilities; and developing job-seeking skills. More than 400 students and over 100

businesses, professionals, government agencies, nonprofits, colleges, and military branches participated. Branch members served on

the planning committee and volunteered at the event by distributing booklets, greeting students, and directing students to their career

cluster booths. (04/11)

C. Three Branch Programs, Projects or Events that Focused on the AAUW Mission

1. Tracy Lardy of Presentation College-Fairmont, spoke about the educational opportunities available at Presentation for

women in the area. Presentation is a Health Science Baccalaureate institution. A total of 133 students were taking college classes at

Presentation last year. Of these 133 college students, 92% were women. Of the 86 students in the Nursing Program, 97% were women.

In addition to the Nursing Program, women are also working on medical degrees in Radiology Technology, Surgical Technology, and

Medical Assisting/Coding. Tracy is the Fairmont Campus Director of Presentation College. (09/11)

2. The Branch has begun work on creating a centralized directory for Martin County that will contain local and area

resources for women in crisis (e.g. abuse, homeless, etc.). The directory will focus on needs such as protection, day care, housing,

health care, job skills, and language barriers.

3. Holiday party, silent auction, and fundraiser were held. Donations totaling \$760.00 were raised for national AAUW

education, advocacy, and research programs. (12/11)

D. Three Steps Taken to Keep & Add New Members

1. An anonymous member offered to pay the non-tax-deductible portion of the membership fee for up to ten new members

for the 2011-2012 membership year. A new member would then only have to pay the national dues, which are totally tax deductible

for her.

2. The Branch encouraged current members to bring at least one guest to one of our meetings during the membership year.

3. Branch members formed a walking unit in Fairmont's annual November Glows Parade. The participating members wore

bright red graduation caps and gowns covered with lights, and handed out candy to the children and cards printed with membership

information to the women along the parade route.

A year ago, the Branch had 40 members; in March 2012, the Branch has 33 members, for a net loss.
