**Secretary's minutes** from September were published in Inklink. Request made to include the bank account balances from the treasurer's report in the secretary minutes. Question raised by Linda as to what should be included in the minutes. Discussion among members. Minutes should reflect decisions made and votes taken, with some informational information shared. No need to include content of discussion. Minutes approved.

**Treasurer's report** was included in Inklink. Only bill paid this month was for the dinner meal for our September speaker. Balance in regular account \$2306, Tour of Homes \$2413. Treasurer's report approved.

Judy asked to reconsider the decision from last month to pay \$250 into the AAUW funds. She provided background information as to our history of giving. After discussion among members, the vote to reconsider failed.

**President's report** DeeAnne shared email from Susan Moody of Hibbing branch and a member of state board nominating committee. Openings on state board for VP of AAUW Funds, VP of Membership, Secretary and Nominating Committee. Applicants must fill out application by November 15. Local members who have served on the state board found the experience valuable and were able to bring perspective from the rural part of the state.

#### Program/visibility committee

The speaker for the November 25 branch meeting will be Ana Novgorodova who works with youth at Grace Lutheran Church. She is from Kazakhstan and holds three master's degrees. DeeAnne Helfritz will host. The December holiday meeting will be at the recently renovated Pioneer museum parsonage building on December 16. Erica taking the lead, with Linda Meschke and Kristin Gaalswyk on hospitality committee. Programs for 2014 still being organized.

**Hospitality committee** continues to work on the schedule and will complete it as soon as locations for 2014 meetings are set. Need host for March – Char indicated she would do so unless inclement weather intervened!

**Public Policy** Char provided a newspaper article reflecting on the founding of the Crisis Support Center 35 years ago; AAUW provided leadership and many volunteers. Training was provided for law enforcement and other front-line staff. Volunteers also were responsible for a 24-hour hotline service. Many of those functions have been now taken over by others, or new technologies have allowed the work to happen differently. However, the need for the work has not stopped: There were 38 domestic assault deaths in Minnesota this year, double that of last year. Char challenged the membership to take action again, 25 years later, to meet the local needs. She also indicated that AAUW state and national would be seeking sex trafficking legislation.

**Historian** received the Crisis Support Center news article and also newspaper articles in the Sentinel and Photo Press regarding Rachel Boztet's on-going project for Women in Transition.

#### **New business**

Reminder that Tour of Homes will happen in the fall of 2014. Time for members to think about the role they might play for this event.

**Program** guests were Allison Schmidt, Superintendent of Martin County West schools; Michelle Rosen, assistant principal of Fairmont Elementary; Kim Niss, principal of Fairmont High School. Each spoke about their own path into educational administration, educational philosophies and what they see for young women and girls in the future.
